National Parks and AONB Review, Call for Evidence A Cotswolds National Park

The Cotswolds Conservation Board has submitted its response to the call for evidence.

As you may be aware there has been a growing debate over the potential for a Cotswolds National Park. A debate that has steadily developed over the last two years and now coincides with your national review.

A media article written by a local writer / journalist: Explores the ambition for a Cotswolds National Park.
