The strategy also compliments other areas of the Board's work such as its position statement on road verge management and the forthcoming Climate Change Strategy

The supporting text in this section of the strategy needs to highlight the strong links between the urban areas and the wider countryside. The city/urban element and the rural/wider landscape element are considered in two separate paragraphs on pages 13 and 14 and need to be brought together. For example, a lot of the wider landscape assets like the Cotswold escarpment, are visible from Bath city centre and some, such as the River Avon and the K&A Canal, penetrate the city. These assets form a visual and physical link between the city and the surrounding countryside as well as routes between the two.

Climate change – GI also provides opportunities to reduce carbon emissions by the provision of green transport – walking and cycling

  - include unimproved grasslands. Could also include hedges and roadside verges if mapping data exists. Some hedgerow survey work has been undertaken by BRERC and it is assumed there are some road verges identified as important for biodiversity (local sites/protected verges)
  - Ecosystem services add aquifers?
  - Accessible open spaces include wider countryside via the rights of way network

Landscape and cultural heritage, page 16, 2<sup>nd</sup> paragraph – may be useful to include that both AONBs have Management Plans that support and would help deliver GI.

Page 16 – heritage is not just parks, gardens and locations on the SMR. It is important to recognise the historic dimension of the wider landscape. This is illustrated in the Avon Historic Landscape Character Assessment.

Page 18 – 2<sup>nd</sup> paragraph states that the District is served by two AONBs. Better wording would be 'the district has parts of two AONBs' Page 19, 1<sup>st</sup> paragraph. The last sentence is an important point and may be worth expanding. The opportunities exist for engaging in the



natural environment. However, many non-participants either do not know the opportunities exist or are not confident or motivated to use them.

Page 19, 3<sup>rd</sup> paragraph – Cotswold <u>Scarp</u> NIA. There is also the Cotswold Rivers NIA, which includes the By Brook, a tributary of the Avon.

Biodiversity Priorities, first bullet point – within and between SNAs. SNAs contain core habitat, but it still tends to be fragmented. Ecosystem Services, page 21 – should it be the National Ecosystem Assessment?

Recreation and open space priorities - the Board supports the inclusion of highway verge maintenance. The Board has a position statement and guide for Parish Councils on the Management of Roadside Verges. Page 27, 3<sup>rd</sup> paragraph – should be Agri-environment Schemes. This would also include EWGS.

Trees and Woodlands – opportunities also include renewable energy (woodfuel and firewood). Tree planting, last paragraph, page 30, needs to take account of landscape character. It can also negatively impact on biodiversity and the historic environment.
