10. Review of investment theme allocations

- At the 29th November meeting, the LAG reviewed the current allocation of funds across the six investment themes against the projected demands for these funds from current applications, Expressions of Interest (EOI) and initial enquiries through the project ideas form. Papers 5b Targets vs Actuals and 5c Application Pipeline were used as the evidence base. Discussion ensued and the following points were made:
- Priority 1 Farming £26,410 unallocated in this theme. There are two EOI's ready to invite to Full Application collectively valued at £46,559. Interest has been consistently strong in this theme and applications tend to have a high conversion rate through to contracted projects.
- Priority 2 Enterprise £282,216 unallocated in this theme. Interest from potential applicants at the early stages is strong. However, the drop-out rate is high due to the speculative nature of enquiries at this stage.
- Priority 3 Tourism £212,395 unallocated in this theme. Interest from potential applicants at the early stages has picked up of late. However, the drop-out rate is high due to the speculative nature of enquiries at this stage.
- Priority 4 Rural Services £2,766 unallocated in this theme. There are currently no further interest from potential applicants at the early stages.
- Priority 5 Culture & Heritage £85,918 unallocated in this theme. There is one potential application for £50,000 at the early stages. However, this application may not progress because the project might not be ready by the end of the Programme. RJW offered to promote this investment theme to his contacts in order to stimulate interest. The LAG were grateful for this offer but also cautioned that if no interest was received by late January, the unallocated resource could be moved to another investment theme where demand was higher. JW added that the Programme team did not have the capacity to drive promotion in this investment theme.
- Priority 6 Forestry £9,933 over-allocation in this theme because an applicant has increased the grant request between EOI and Full Application. There is no further interest from potential applicants at the early stages.
- For clarity, the allocated figure is the sum of money assigned to Full Applications in Development, Full Applications received, Full Applications in Appraisal and QC and all Approved, Contracted and Completed projects. Therefore, the balance is the unallocated figure.
- The LAG **recommended** reallocating an additional £75,000 to Priority 1 Farming to allow the current EOIs to progress and support additional applicants in this investment theme.

- The LAG **recommended** supporting this reallocation by moving:
- £20,000 from Priority 2 Enterprise
- £40,000 from Priority 3 Tourism
- £15,000 from Priority 5 Culture & Heritage.
- In respect of the above reallocation, the LAG **recommended** a reduction of 4.1 in the jobs target, consisting of: 2 jobs from Priority 2 Enterprise, 1.6 jobs from Priority 3 Tourism and 0.5 jobs from Culture & Heritage. Total = 4.1. The rationale for the reduction in the jobs target is because investments in Priority 1 Farming projects so far have not created new jobs but have significantly improved farm productivity and animal welfare and enabled existing staff to be redeployed to other farming activities.
- The Accountable Body; The Cotswolds Conservation Board, would consider this recommendation and make a final decision at a Board meeting on 7th December.
- It was agreed that a further review of the investment themes takes place at the 14th February LAG meeting to coincide with the 22nd March 2018 Board meeting of the Accountable Body.

Priority 1 - Support to increase farm productivity

<u>Tresham Farm, Wotton under Edge, Gloucestershire</u> £10,059.48 grant towards a cluster flush system.

The cluster flush system was operational by December 2016 and aims to reduce the cases of mastitis. This brings herd health and welfare benefits, as well as increased yields. Next quarterly report due: 31 December 2017.

<u>Cotstone Lodge, Broadway, Worcestershire</u> £5,206 grant towards a mobile sheep handling system. Final Claim submitted: 30 October 2017 First report due: 16 November 2018

<u>Manor Farm, Malmesbury, Wiltshire</u> £49,958.21 grant towards a robotic milking system. Final Claim due: 17 November 2017 First report due: 17 November 2018

Wall Farm, Aldsworth, Gloucestershire £20,450 grant towards a cluster flush & EID system. Final Claim due: 31 January 2018 First report due: 31 October 2018 Middle Hill Farm, Chippenham, Wiltshire £20,048 grant towards a cluster flush system & cow mattresses. First Claim due: 30 June 2018 First report due: 30 November 2018

Priority 2 - Support for micro & small businesses (non-agricultural) and farm diversification

Westend Office Suites, Stonehouse, Gloucestershire www.westendofficesuites.co.uk £39,999.98 grant towards 10 new business units.

The units were built and completed by October 2016. Report to 31/03/2017: the offices are finished to a high standard and have had full or near full occupancy since completion, supporting 10 local businesses and creating 2 indirect jobs. Next report due 31/03/2018.

Saltpig Curing Company Ltd, Chipping Norton, Oxfordshire www.saltpigcuring.co.uk £13,011.32 grant towards the conversion and fit out of a business unit. 2 jobs created.

Completed in April 2017, the grant supported the fitting of chillers, a drying room and associated equipment to accommodate this meat curing start-up business. The curing process can take 6-12 months so there will be a lag time before the business can actually sell the products. A new website has been launched and we are awaiting the LEADER logos to be incorporated, due 30/09/2017. (MP 01/09/2017). First report due: 30/05/2018.

<u>Vegetable Matters, Ebrington, Gloucestershire</u> <u>www.vegetablematters.co.uk</u> £48,849 grant towards the construction of new farm shop. 5.07 jobs created (target 3.5).

The new farm shop opened in July 2017 employing 3 new members of staff. Because of demand, the number of staff was increased in August. Employee numbers confirmed in first report submitted in October 2017. Also in October, Vegetable Matters wins the Campaign to Protect Rural England (CPRE) county awards scheme for its sustainable building design and community benefits. Second report due: 30/09/2018.

£47,972.97 grant towards an extension to double the retail space of the existing farm shop.

As at October 2017, all works have been completed and the 3rd and final grant claim has been submitted. First report due: 30 June 2018.

Priority 3 - Support for rural tourism

The two bespoke wooden holiday homes were finished and ready for guests in July 2017. First report due: 31 December 2017.

Priority 6 - Support for increasing forestry productivity

The processor was in operation by January 2017. On a site visit in February, the applicant demonstrated the capacity of the processor and noted that it has allowed him to increase production in less time with greater safety. First report due: 30/11/2017.
